All Star Baseball Academy & Babe Ruth League History

All-Star Baseball Academy



The Delaware Valley's largest organization for developing young athletes through instruction, competition and mentoring, is celebrating 10 years in business. Founded in 1998, ASBA has grown from a single location to four facilities serving more than one million young athletes each year.

"In this business, 10 years is a major milestone as many facilities come and go," said Jim Freeman, director of Operations at ASBA. "We offer programs for individuals and teams at all levels. From our lessons to our special programs and sports camps, there is something at ASBA for all athletes interested in baseball. Since our inception, we have had more than 300 kids go on to play collegiate baseball and 12 drafted to the major leagues."

Founded in 1998, John Stefanik and Mike Manning opened ASBA's first facility (12,500 square feet) in Broomall. The second location opened in West Chester in 2003 as the first and largest indoor facility in the tri-county area. In 2004, Freeman, the owner of a sports facility in Downingtown, and Stefanik, became partners, adding a third facility to the ASBA umbrella. Last year, the fourth ASBA facility opened in Warminster-Hatboro and the Downingtown facility re-located to a larger facility. In the 10 years since ASBA was founded, it has grown to four facilities, in three counties totaling 80,000 square feet.

Babe Ruth League



Over fifty-five years ago, a group of men dedicated to the youth of America met in a suburb of Trenton, New Jersey, and formed what became the very first Babe Ruth League. This group of men eventually agreed to name Marius D. Bonacci as the "founder" of the program which was initially registered under the name Little Bigger League. The program was renamed in 1954 when Claire Ruth, Babe Ruth's widow, who had learned of the merits of the organization and its tremendous growth, met with the administrators. She subsequently gave the organization permission to change its name to Babe Ruth League. She has been quoted as saying, "Babe Ruth was a man who loved children and baseball; he could receive no greater tribute than to have a youth baseball program named after him." Babe Ruth League, Inc. caught on nationally, then internationally. It now ranks as the premier amateur baseball and softball program in the world.
